

# INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN GWINNETT COUNTY, GEORGIA AND THE CITY OF SNELLVILLE REGARDING SIDEWALKS ON SKYLAND DRIVE AND PINEHURST ROAD

This Agreement (hereinafter referred to as "AGREEMENT"), made and entered into by and between Gwinnett County, Georgia, a political subdivision of the State of Georgia headquartered at 75 Langley Drive, Lawrenceville, Georgia 30046, (hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY") and the City of Snellville, a municipal corporation chartered by the State of Georgia and headquartered at 2342 Oak Road, Snellville Georgia 30078 (hereinafter referred to as "CITY") each of whom has been duly authorized to enter into this AGREEMENT.

#### WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the parties to this AGREEMENT are governmental units located within Gwinnett County, Georgia and authorized by law to enter into intergovernmental agreements; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to serve the needs of the citizens of Gwinnett County and the City of Snellville by providing safe and efficient roadway and pedestrian improvements within the COUNTY and CITY; and

WHEREAS, both parties believe that it would be in the interest of the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the COUNTY and the CITY to combine their resources and efforts to undertake a joint transportation project;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, and undertakings set forth herein and other good and valuable consideration the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties hereto do consent and agree as follows:

- 1. The CITY and the COUNTY have agreed to fund a transportation project (hereinafter referred to as the "Project") to install sidewalks on Skyland Drive between Eldorado Place and Rockdale Circle and on Pinehurst Road between North Road and Knob Creek Road.
- The COUNTY shall contribute EIGHT HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS AND ZERO CENTS (\$800,000.00) to the Project. The current estimated cost of the Project is ONE MILLION NINE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS AND ZERO CENTS (\$1,900,000.00).
- 3. The CITY will manage the Project and is responsible for the remaining Project costs. In no event shall the COUNTY's contribution exceed \$800,000.
- 4. The COUNTY's payment to the CITY shall be in the form of a reimbursement. Upon receipt of an invoice from the CITY, the COUNTY shall remit payment within 30 days.

As to the Project, the parties agree that neither the COUNTY nor the CITY shall indemnify or hold harmless the other party's agents, inspectors, servants, and employees, past and present. Both the CITY and the COUNTY, if requested, shall assume, and defend at their own cost, any suit, action, or other legal proceeding arising out of this AGREEMENT or the Project.

All notices pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall be served as follows: As to the COUNTY, Chairwoman, Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners, 75 Langley Drive, Lawrenceville, Georgia 30046. As to the CITY, Mayor, City of Snellville, 2342 Oak Road, Snellville Georgia 30078.

This AGREEMENT constitutes the entire written agreement between the parties hereto as to all matters contained herein. All subsequent changes to this contract must be in writing and signed by both parties. This AGREEMENT is for the benefit of the parties hereto only and is not intended to benefit any third party or to give rise to any duty or causes of action for any third party, and no provisions contained within this AGREEMENT are intended to nor shall they in any way be construed to relieve any contractor performing services in connection with the Project of any liability or to complete the work in a good, substantial, and workmanlike manner. No provision in this AGREEMENT is intended to nor shall it be construed to in any way waive immunities or protections provided to either the COUNTY or to the CITY by the Constitution and laws of the State of Georgia.
